**Context:** Winston believes O'Brien says this to him in a dream.

**Meaning:** Winston sees it as symbolizing hope and rebellion.

**Reality:** The “place without darkness” turns out to be the brightly lit prison cell.

**Why It Matters:**

- The quote shows how hope is twisted into betrayal.

**Theme Connection:** False hope; manipulation; psychological control.

**“He had won the victory over himself. He loved Big Brother.”**
