- Happy – feeling or showing joy
- Healthy – in good physical or mental condition
- Honest – truthful and sincere
- Hopeful – full of optimism
- Humble – modest and not boastful
- Helpful – willing to assist others
- Hardworking – putting in steady effort
- Hearty – warm and enthusiastic
- Harmonious – peaceful and balanced
- Hospitable – friendly and welcoming

Neutral & Descriptive Adjectives

- Heavy – having great weight
- Huge – very large
- Heated – made warm
- Hidden – not easily seen
- Hollow – empty inside

- Historical – related to the past
- Human – related to people
- Horizontal – flat from side to side
- Humid – slightly wet or moist
- Hypothetical – based on an idea, not real

Negative Adjectives (For Learning Contexts)

- Hopeless – without hope
- Hostile – unfriendly
- Harsh – rough or severe
- Haughty – overly proud
- Helpless – unable to help oneself
- Hasty – done too quickly
- Hesitant – unsure or slow to act
- Heartless – lacking kindness
- Horrid – very unpleasant
- Hollow-hearted – lacking emotion
