Purpose: To guide students in clearly presenting their academic background, goals, and motivation for applying to a chosen program.

1. Introduction (Motivation & Interest)

Briefly introduce yourself and explain why you are interested in this field.

- What sparked your interest in this area of study?
- When did you first realize you wanted to pursue it?

2. Academic Background

Describe your educational background and how it prepared you for this program.

- Degree(s) completed or currently pursuing

3. Practical Experience (If Applicable)

Explain relevant work experience, internships, research, or projects.
